Reading

We know how important reading is. Please make sure your child is reading at least 3 times per week (but regular daily reading is most beneficial).

- Research from the National Literacy Trust has shown us that children and young people who like to read are three times more likely to have better mental health than those who don't. In fact, reading for just 6 minutes has been shown to reduce stress by up to 68%, making it one of the most effective ways to ease tension in the body and the mind!
- Children who read are more likely to do better at school and make more progress across the curriculum.
- Children who read are more likely to develop empathy and creativity.
- Reading for pleasure is a more powerful factor in life achievement than socio-economic background.
